Product Information and Instructions

The Your Child Can Discover! Deluxe Kit includes 6 DVDs, 6 Lift-the-Flap Books, and one Music CD.

All of the topics (numbers, colors, logic patterns, geometric shapes, music, prepositions, and opposites) are covered on each DVD and the difficulty level increases with each disc.

Since this is for children from 3 months to 7 years of age, children will go through the schedule at different rates. Babies may be learning from this program for 2 years or more, as there is a lot of important content. A small percentage of children may know almost all of the information in Step 1. If that is the case, advance to Step 2 earlier than the recommended schedule.





After viewing the video, try acting out what we do in the videos. For instance, you can try using toys and other objects to make patterns.

Follow the instructions in the books and enjoy teaching your child! Initially, focus on the words on the top of the flaps and only the main ideas from each page. As your child learns more from the videos and acts out what is on the screen, teach more of the concepts in the books.



Please use the Music CD while reading the music book some of the time. The CD encourages your child to sing and hum in pitch. Lift the flaps and turn the pages when you hear the appropriate sounds. Try your best to answer the questions and sing in pitch. Do this with your child many times until your child can do it independently. If you don't sing that well, then let our professional singers demonstrate the pitch. Encourage your child to hum or sing in pitch and play the notes on a keyboard or piano as you read the book (when you are not using the CD).

Your Baby/Child Can Discover! Viewing Schedule

Start with the purple disc called **Your BABY Can Discover Step**1. Watch Step 1 about once a day for about two months. Use all six books.

If you are using this series with a baby, keep it simple and focus on the big words on the flaps. In a few months, you can introduce more of the information that is under the flaps.



Watch Your Baby Can Discover Step 2 about once a day for about two months. Review the first disc at least once a week. Please use at least some of the books daily. It is likely better to go through the books at a fast pace many times a week instead of going at a slow pace just a few times a week. Some of the information will be too difficult for young babies, so continue to focus on the words on the big flaps.



Allow your child to watch **Your Baby Can Discover Step 3** about once a day for about two months. Review Step 1 and Step 2 about once a week. As much as you can, act out or demonstrate some of the activities that you see in the videos with objects while you interact with your baby. Be sure to ask your child questions in a way that is similar to how we do it in the DVDs.



Next, show the orange disc called **Your CHILD Can Discover Step 1** (the fourth disc in the series). Focus on this video for about one month. Review the previous videos several times a month. Continue using the books and the music CD. The videos are very interactive, but it is even better if parents watch with their children and encourage them to participate. At other times throughout the day, act out what you see in the videos and ask your child questions about the topics.



Allow your child to watch **Your Child Can Discover Step 2** (the fifth disc in the series) about once a day for about two months. Review the previous videos several times a month. Continue using the books and doing activities that are in the books and videos with your child. Use the books and ask your child many questions about all of the topics in the books. Use the music book and audio CD frequently to introduce your child to musical pitch.



Show Your Child Can Discover Step 3 (the sixth disc in the series) until your child learns most of the information from the videos. There is a lot of information in this video, so it may take a long time to learn everything. Continue viewing the first five videos according to your child's abilities and interests. Demonstrate activities from the books and the videos with actual objects and actions. Play notes on a keyboard. Encourage your child to sing or hum in pitch.
